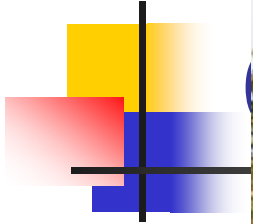


View from Germonds Road



Germonds Cemetery

- Dedicated as cemetery ca. 1865
- Some Revolutionary War graves
- Present size about 12 acres
- Over 4300 interments to date
- Developed and undeveloped areas will accommodate about 4000 additional interments

- Continue to be non-denominational

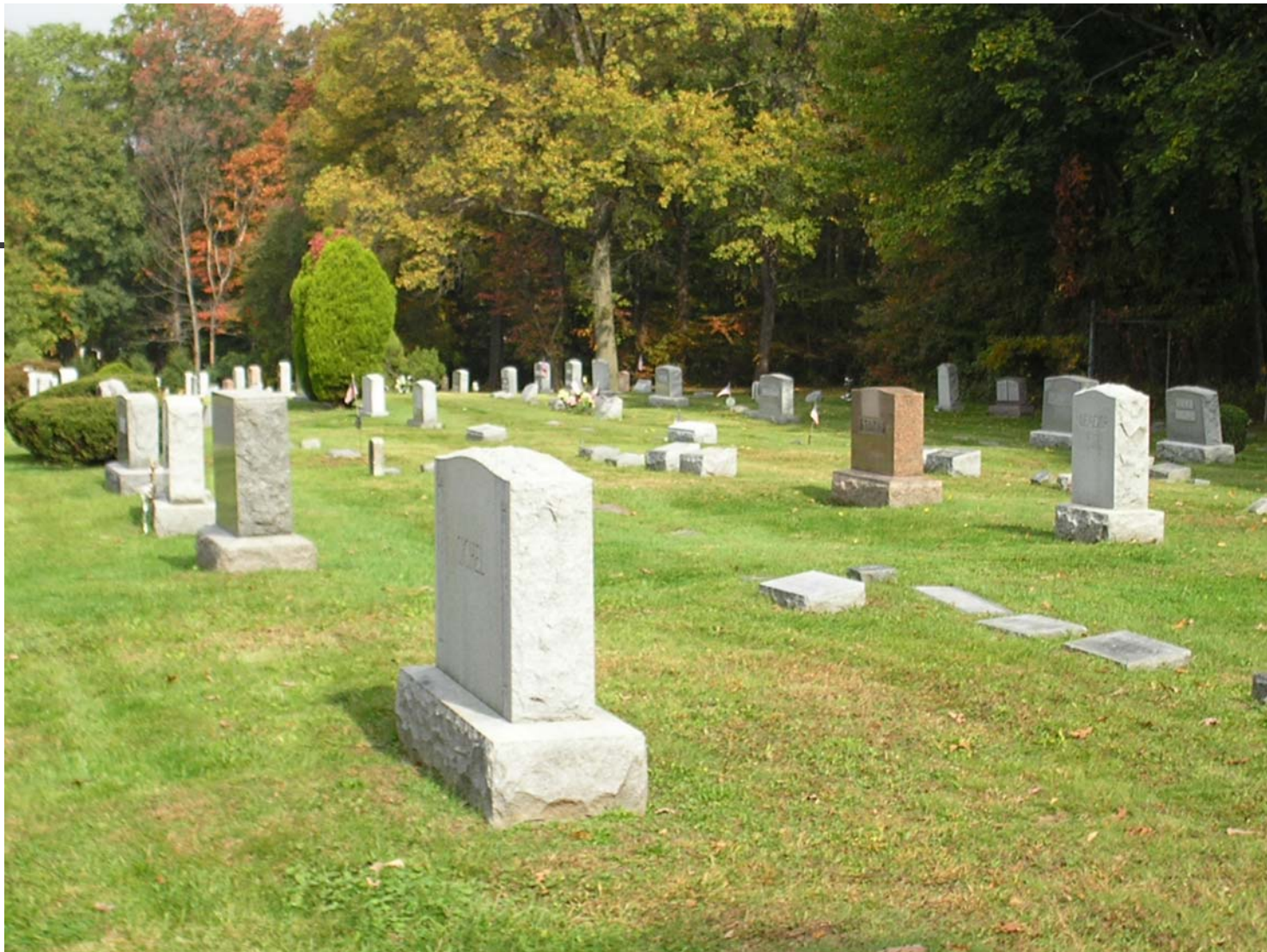
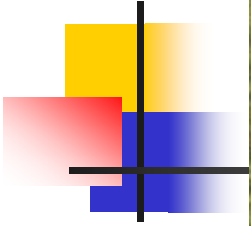
Interment Options

- In-ground Burial of Cremains

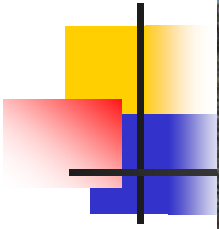




Old upright monument section



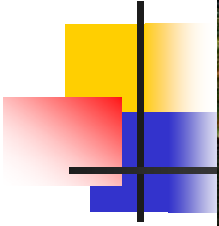
**Newer upright and in-ground monument section
